Even when we don't meet together, the bills still come, so please maintain your financial support and give extra if you can, it will help to make up for those who cannot give.

This decision was not made easily, in fact, I struggled to seek what is best for our church, and for the larger community of Knoxville. Worshipping together is still vital to our existence as a church, but for now, we will worship together but from separate locations. Soon, we will gather again in person, lifting high the name of Jesus through preaching and song.
